Special Events: Besides the regular game schedule, we offer a number of special events during the year including club, STAC, Sectional and Regional tournaments as well as our Tuesday afternoon Jackpot game. In addition, our entertainment committee has a special event each month featuring a game and very nice lunch. We have several Pro-Am events which are very popular and on the first Monday of each month, we have a cake to celebrate that month's Birthdays. For more information check the Calendar and Events schedule on our web site.

Lessons before most Limited Games: Our Bridge Directors are very good teachers and before most Limited Games, they have a 15-30 minute lesson covering topics of interest to you. You may also ask a Bridge Director to cover a specific subject for you. On our web site, we list the topics to be covered in the coming weeks. Before some games, the Bridge Directors have a Question and Answer (Q&A) session where you can pose that problem hand or inquire about the details of a convention. On Thursday afternoon, there is a lesson and Q&A session for the Open players conducted by Spike Lay.

Club Membership: Club Membership is \$10 per year due on November 1. The year runs from November 1st through October 31st. Benefits of club membership include: Reduced game fess (\$4 instead of \$5), Membership Directory, use of Library and the Learning Center. Members joining after July 1st will be charged \$5 for the duration of the year (ending on Oct 31st).

ACBL: Join ACBL! Your Masterpoints are automatically updated and you can check them online at the ACBL web site. As an ACBL member, you pay reduced entry fees at tournaments and you receive their highly readable and very educational monthly magazine "ACBL Bridge Bulletin."

Bridge Results Online: After each game, our Bridge Directors upload the game results to [our web site](#). The results are displayed in two parts: the game which displays the ranked results by pairs or teams and below that, the boards showing the scores by board for each pair. It is easy to see what others did on the board and ask: Did we bid too much? Too little? Were we in the wrong contract? Was our defense good?

Cost per Game: Regular games are \$4 for members and \$5 for non-members. Special games such as Charity games and STAC games are \$1 more. Tournaments and special Swiss games vary with the event.

Library: Our Library contains a wonderful selection of Bridge books and magazines donated by our members for our members. If you have Bridge books you no longer need, please consider donating them to the club Library.

Need a Partner: Call the Club when you need a partner and the Bridge Directors will do their best (which is very good) to find you one. If the club is closed, leave a message with your name, phone number, playing strength and the date you need a partner.

Zero Tolerance Policy for Unacceptable Behavior: Behavior is unacceptable if it makes Bridge less enjoyable for others. **From ACBL:** “The following list are some examples of behavior which will not be tolerated: (1) Badgering, rudeness, insinuations, intimidation, profanity, threats, or violence. (2) Negative comments concerning opponents' or partner's play or bidding. (3) Constant and gratuitous lessons and analyses at the table. (4) Loud and disruptive arguing with a director's ruling.”

Learning Center: The Learning Center is another avenue to learning about Bridge and our Bridge Club via computers and the Internet. Mini-classes, offered on demand, include: web site tours, Q&A sessions on computer or internet problems and on the use of the Bridge Software on the Learning Center Computer.

Tuesday Afternoon Jackpot Game: The jackpot starts at \$10 and grows by \$10 a week until \$100 is reached. If more than one winner, the jackpot is split. When the jackpot is won, it starts at \$10 the next Tuesday. Jackpot is awarded only if the game has 7 or more tables. To win: 0-299 need a 58% game, 300-999 need 63% and 1000+ need 70%.

Finally, all games are stratified so if you don't win or place in the **A**, you still could do so in **B** or **C**. Play up whenever you can.
